

How much or how far is a government allowed to interfere with the actions of a fully rational adult, whilst maintaining autonomy in general?

VERY LITTLE




On Liberty

For humanity to flourish it needs freedom

LIBERTY

Government may NOT interfere with the actions of a fully rational adult (paternalism)



"A State which dwarfs its men, in order that they may be docile instruments in its hands even for beneficial purposes – will find that with small men no great thing can really be accomplished."


On Liberty (1859)

Purpose of government is to aid its citizens to flourish - not impose restrictions to live according to a particular doctrine.

Flourishing occurs by letting men and women pursue their own paths, engaging them equally with passions and duties

Non-interference in the private choices of adults, regardless of what those choices are

UNLESS OTHERS ARE HARMED (The Harm Principle – too technical for this discussion)



"[T]he only purpose for which power can be rightfully exercised over any member of a civilised community, against his will, is to prevent harms to others."

On Liberty (1859)

The Problem of the Sadistic Man (Feinberg)

People can only achieve individuality, selffulfilment and happiness in a society that does not arbitrarily rescind their rights

Unobstructed and the opening of paths = liberty

Liberty Today

MODERN LIBERAL DEMOCRACIES (ideals)

- Equal suffrage
- Equal access to jobs
- No discrimination based on sex, race, sexual orientation, religion (or lack thereof)
- Free speech, expression and alternate press coverages
- Access to information
- Education for all

MODERN LIBERAL DEMOCRACIES opposed by religions

- Gay marriages
- Adultery
- Abortions

MODERN LIBERAL DEMOCRACIES (not fully realised)

- Prostitution should be legalised
- Free speech still not recognised (Jewel of Medina)



POWER REMAINS IN OUR HANDS


- Living under democracy does not mean we are ruled, we are governed

"The major reason for the slow pace of development in the Third World is the subjection of women there. Elementary education sufficient to make women basically literate and numerate is known to reduce rates of childbirth and infant mortality in Africa, to enhance the prospects of their children receiving education, and to reduce the rate of HIV infection among the women themselves.

When women are allowed to own property (as opposed to merely being property) HIV infection rates are lower, too, because there women are not simply handed from father to husband, and from the graveside of husband to another, but can if orphaned or widowed choose to make shift for themselves and their children autonomously."
